Kiama Municipal Council has a commitment to provide a safe and secure environment in the Kiama Local Government Area as a strategy of Kiama Municipal Council's Community Strategic Plan (1.6 - Recognise and promote community safety throughout the municipality). Closed-circuit television (CCTV) can be utilised as a cost effective tool to assist in the maintenance of this environment. Therefore the objectives of the implementation of a CCTV system are:

- promotion of community safety and crime prevention
- protection of Kiama Municipal Council employees, residents and visitors
- protect of Kiama Municipal Council assets
- reduction in management costs via the remote monitoring of assets
- protection of the environment

## Rights of Access to Information

A member of the public has the right to apply for access to personal information held by Council in the following ways:

- a. A person can apply for the information under the *Privacy and Personal Information Protection Act 1998*, (PIPPA).
- b. A person can apply for information under the *Government Information (Public Access) Act 2009*, (GIPA).
