5.1 Alteration to existing "No Stopping" zone – Woolworths Pedestrian Crossing – Terralong Street, Kiama

#### 5.3 Jamberoo ANZAC March - Saturday 22 April 2023

- the road closures to be undertaken by organisers in compliance with the Traffic Management Plan Nos. 6134 and T2305-0415 prepared by Traffic Logistics Pty Ltd and Traffic Management Services Pty Ltd, with the following amendments:
  - a) Closure start and end times be included on both plans
  - b) Heavy vehicle alternative arrangements be identified, noting the detour route along Colley Drive has a "No Trucks 4.5T" restriction;
- notification of this closure be given to Police, Local Emergency Services, businesses and residents effected by the closure;
- 3) an advertisement be placed in the local media advising of the closure;
- proof of public liability insurance complying with the Australian Prudential Regulatory Authority (APRA) being provided to Council prior to the event; and
- 5) vehicles be used to create a physical barrier on the street to protect pedestrians and participants of the march.

#### 6 GENERAL BUSINESS

#### **Taylor Street**

The issue has been ongoing for a number of years.

MD advised one way was not an option.

Kim from Kiama Buses outlined that buses had been using this road for over 30 years.

Council conducted a speed count on the road. This may need to be revisited.

AG asked about previous responses to the issue.

Gareth Ward has been involved in issues raised by residents.

Kim advised that their buses could be tracked.

DC suggested the Committee should contact the bus companies to advise drivers to use caution in the street.

MD had advised that a footpath for Taylor St had been added for future works.

The Committee recommended that the bus company representative would advise drivers to use caution on Taylor St.

And to review the bus routes. Kim also committed to reviewing the speed tracking.

#### **Belinda Street**

DC – need to address urgently the issues in Belinda St regarding parking either side, reducing the road width available. It was previously proposed that a study be conducted in the area after the completion of major building works in the area. These have now been completed.

Janelle advised the shop owner on the corner of Morrow St had contacted Council on a number of occasions. He is requesting timed parking for that site.

A formal report will be prepared for the May meeting regarding this request.

The committee noted a traffic study is also booked in for Belinda St Gerringong and is in the future works budget.

5.1 Implementation of timed parking zone –141 Belinda Street, Gerringong (cont)

#### **Background**


Council has received reports from the shop owner of 141 Belinda Street, Gerringong who has concerns with parking at this location and the shop owner has requested timed parking along the frontage of the shop.

Council has been advised there is an ongoing issue with vehicles parking for long periods of time in front of the shop at 141 Belinda Street, Gerringong. The vehicles that are parking in this location for long periods of time are preventing potential customers from being able to park to access the shop as currently there is no limits on parking.

It is proposed that a half hour parking zone with the introduction of regulatory signage implemented at this location with the aim to provide the following road safety benefits:

- Improve short term parking including pick up and drop offs.
- Improve loading and unloading for shop keepers.
- Improve parking compliance with the NSW road rules.
- Improve parking turnover for shop keepers.

Belinda Street, Gerringong has been identified as a location for future traffic and parking studies with the aim to improve traffic flow in this location.

5.2 Implementation of timed parking zone – Jamberoo Post Office, Jamberoo (cont)


#### Background

Council has received reports from the Jamberoo Valley Ratepayers and Residents Association who has concerns with parking at this location.

Council has been advised of parking issues around the Jamberoo Post Office as there are many community members with relatively limited mobility who drive to the Jamberoo Post Office, on the corner of Allowrie and Young streets, to collect their mail and conduct their business. Parking spaces immediately outside the post office are frequently occupied for quite extended periods by patrons of the next-door café.

- Improve short term parking including pick up and drop offs.
- Improve loading and unloading for Post Office users.
- Improve parking compliance with the NSW road rules.
- Improve parking turnover for Post Office users.

On this basis, it is proposed to introduce fifteen minute timed parking zone be installed with regulatory signage and line marking be installed at this location as per the attached signage and line marking plan.
