3 CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING

3.1 Kiama Local Traffic Committee on 6 November 2022

4 BUSINESS ARISING FROM THE MINUTES

MD noted that he has not yet contacted Railways regarding the proposed wombat crossing on the corner of Railway Parde and Bong Bong Street Kiama, to advise that this has been assessed by Council's Engineers, and that there are no concerns in terms of the loading. MD advised that he will write to Railways to confirm this shortly and that Council will be proceeding with the wombat crossing.

5 REPORT OF RMS DELEGATED FORMAL ITEMS

5.1 Road Closure - O'Keefe Place, Kiama - Beach Tag Event

Resolved that the Committee recommends that the traffic changes associated with the event on Saturday 4 March 2023 from 7:00 a.m. to 9 p.m. be approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The event organiser comply with the Traffic Management Plan shown in Attachment 1
- Notification of the closures be given to Police, local emergency services, businesses and affected residents by the event organiser, including the holiday park.
- 3. Signage to be placed along Bonaira Street stating "Side road closed ahead".
- 4. Notification of the closures shall be placed on Council's website a minimum of seven days prior to the event.

5.2 Road Closure - Terralong Street, Kiama - Kiama Jazz and Blues Festival

Resolved that the Committee recommends that the traffic changes associated with the event from 10 a.m. to 6 p.m. on Sunday 12 March 2023 be approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The event organiser comply with the Traffic Management Plan shown in Attachment 1.
- 2. Notification of the closures be given to Police, local emergency services, transport agencies businesses and affected residents by the event organiser a minimum of seven (7) days prior to the event.
- 3. The Traffic Management Plan be updated to include hostile vehicle mitigation measures and the organiser is notified with this condition.
- Access will need to be maintained for police and emergency vehicles.
- 5. Notification of the closures shall be placed on Council's website a minimum of seven (7) days prior to the event.

5.3 Road Closure - O'Keefe Place, Kiama - Wind and Waves Festival

Resolved that the Committee recommends that the traffic changes associated with the event on Saturday 11 and Sunday 12 February 2023, from 6 a.m to 6 p.m. each day, be approved subject to the following conditions:

- 1. The event organiser comply with the Traffic Management Plan shown in Attachment 1.
- 2. Notification of the closures be given to Police, local emergency services, businesses, the holiday park and affected residents especially near the entrance to the event, by the event organiser a minimum of seven (7) days prior to the event.
- 3. Notification of the closures shall be placed on Council's website a minimum of seven (7) days prior to the event.
- 4. Residents, including van park visitors will be permitted to gain vehicular access to their properties at all times.

6 GENERAL BUSINESS

6.1 Technical Advice - Barney Street Kiss and Drop Zone - Ss Peter and Paul Catholic School

Members of the Committee inspected the Kiss and Drop Zone at Ss Peter and Paul Catholic School between 8.30am and 9.00am on Tuesday 7 February, to watch the busy drop off period and witness any issues that might occur on a typical day, in response to an anonymous complaint from a concerned parent, regarding the kiss and drop zone.

AG advised that the Principal of Ss Peter and Paul Catholic School was very helpful, approachable, and offered his services as the Principal to accommodate students with special needs, parking onsite or on school grounds. The Principal also offered the use of the side gate at the school which is closer to that parking area.

DC advised that the whole issue could have been resolved quite quickly between the concerned parent and the Principal of the school, who has offered to do whatever is required to accommodate the needs of the concerned parent and her child.

JB agreed that the principal was more than willing to accommodate the needs of the concerned parent. This issue is something that can be addressed by the school, rather than changes to treatments by Council or TfNSW.

CG added that this school has one of the larger areas for parking and drop off, compared to other schools.

MD advised that Council will write back to the concerned parent, advising that the Traffic Committee have inspected the site, and spoken to the principal who was very accommodating and would welcome the opportunity to have a conversation with the concerned parent, to see what arrangements can be made to assist. Council will continue to monitor the situation.

AG and SL suggested that we investigate shortening the bus zone, JB advised that this will need to be done in consultation with the bus company, and changing the 'no parking zones' near the school driveway.

6.2 Technical Advice - Kiama High School Wombat Crossing

JB advised that Council has the material ready to install for the wombat crossing. Council is currently investigating lighting in response to the TfNSW recommendations, and are still waiting on quotes through Vendorpanel. At this stage, we have not received any quotations back, so Council will approach individual lighting companies.
