

Earthworks and retaining walls

Types of earthworks

Earthworks can include:

- cutting/excavating soil
- filling/depositing soil

Retaining walls

Retaining walls include all built vertical landscaping elements designed to retain soil. Retaining walls can be on property boundaries or located within properties.

Is approval from Council required?

Council approval may or may not be required depending on the works planned.

1. Exempt development (no approval required)

The State Environmental Planning Policy (Exempt and Complying Development Codes) 2008 provides standards for earthworks, retaining walls and structural support.

Earthworks, retaining walls and structural supports of a maximum depth/height of 600 millimetres do not require approval.

2. Development application

If the requirements for exempt earthworks, retaining walls and structural support cannot be satisfied, a development application must be lodged with Council.

Chapter 4 of the Kiama Development Control Plan (DCP) limits cutting and filling of a site to 900 millimetres away from the perimeter of a building.

Chapter 2 of the Kiama Development Control Plan (DCP) requires the submission of a Soil Analysis Report with development applications that involve:

- · removing soil from site
- bringing soil onto site.

Dividing fences

Retaining walls may also form part of a dividing fence. For more information on dividing fences refer to Council's Fences Fact Sheet.



Lodgement of a development application

Submission of a development application must be accompanied by the development application fee.

Fee estimates can be requested by using Council's online request form.
