6 GENERAL BUSINESS

6.1 Traffic safety at the corner of Bridges Road and Rowlins Road, Gerringong

DC advised that he has received an email from a resident in 55 Bridges Road, regarding the corner of Bridges Road and Rowlins Road Gerringong. It is claimed that drivers heading north along Rowlins Road onto Bridges Road, are wandering to the wrong side of the road. The resident advised that the signage at the intersection is extremely faded, but the line marking is fine.

DC advised that the issue appears to be driver behaviour, and that traffic need to stay legally on the left hand side of the road. DC is to forward the email to Council, and also send in a request to upgrade the current signage.

6.2 Request for No Parking for Ritchie Place, Minnamurra

MW requested that Ritchie Place become a 'no parking zone', near the entrance to Bike Skills track. RI advised that children that are being dropped off to the bike track, will be dropped off in the actual car park, not in Ritchie Place. DB will investigate this proposal and report in future meetings.

6.3 Intersection at Federal Street and Charles Avenue, Minnamurra -

MH referred to a cyclist accident that occurred on Federal Street and Charles Avenue, Minnamurra in February 2021. DB advised that Council are deploying traffic counters to collect speed data, before investigating options for this intersection. RI advised that narrowing the southern lane of the road could cause more safety issues for vehicles, as it is already quite a tight turn to get into Federal Street from Charles Avenue. MH advise to wait for the data before a decision is made.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Committee approve a 'No Parking' and 'No Stopping' zones, in Myamba Street, Gerringong, with the installation of regulatory signage and line marking.

BACKGROUND

Council has received reports from residents in Myamba Street, Gerringong who have concerns with pedestrian and traffic issues in this location.

Myamba Street is short but very narrow and is a steep, two-way street which allows traffic to 'exit' mainly from the busy Noble Street. Inspections have shown that when vehicles are parked on both sides of the street it is difficult for vehicles to pass safety.

Apartment buildings along Noble Street are now completed, and visitor parking is at a premium with a two hour parking limit.


Council has been advised that parking issues are exacerbated when events are held in nearby Old School Park (particularly Markets). Reports have been received of sight lines issues for motorists turning into Myamba Street from the west, limited passing room for a vehicles and pedestrian activity on the roadway.

It is proposed that the installation 'No Parking' and 'No Stopping' zones with the introduction of regulatory signage and line marking in Myamba Street and at the Noble Street intersection, will provide the following road safety benefits:


- Improve traffic congestion and pedestrian safety
- Reduce possible of collisions.
- Improve parking compliance with the NSW road rules.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Committee endorse for Council to apply for grant funding from Transport for NSW, in order to engage a traffic consultant to prepare a comprehensive Pedestrian Access and Mobility Plan around Kiama Public School..

BACKGROUND

Following the receipt by Council of correspondence from Kiama Public School P&C sub-committee relating to traffic matters and road safety around the school, a meeting was held on site with Council's Road Safety Officer, Ms Janelle Burns and Transport for NSW (TfNSW) representatives, including Mr Andy Gaudiosi and the Kiama Public School Principal, Ms Natalie Marshall on Wednesday 21 April 2021.

The concerns raised by the School's P&C sub-committee and the more than thirty recommendations contained in the correspondence were acknowledged and discussed. Further on-site meeting and discussions have taken place with members of the School P & C, since that time.

After reviewing the recommendations put forward by the P&C to address road safety concerns from the school community, Council is proposing to engage a traffic consultant to undertake a comprehensive evaluation of traffic issues around the school precinct, including the P&C recommendations. It is envisaged this study will develop a systematic pedestrian infrastructure and road safety improvement plan for Council to implement.

While Council currently has no budget for the traffic consulting works, TfNSW currently has an extensive program of measures in place focusing on the safety of children and young people. The School Zone Infrastructure program is part of the \$540 million

5.2 Kiama Public School Road Safety (cont)

Federal Stimulus NSW Road Safety Program, which was announced on 4 March 2021. Council is eligible to seek funding for a Pedestrian Access Mobility Plan under this program.

Council will actively seek funding through the NSW school zone infrastructure program to undertake the traffic safety consulting works.

5.3 Meehan Drive and Alexander Avenue Intersection

RECOMMENDATION


That the Committee approve cross hatching to be installed on the eastern corner of the intersection of Meehan Drive and Alexander Avenue, Kiama Downs, to prevent vehicles parking close to the corner.

BACKGROUND

Council has received correspondence outlining concerns in relation to the danger of vehicles turning right from Alexander Avenue into Meehan Drive, Kiama Downs.

A number of near misses have been reported to Council due to reports of poor sight distance when vehicles are parked on the southern side of Meehan Drive near the intersection. Sight distance at this location is further impacted for vehicles exiting Alexander Avenue onto Meehan Drive, due to a crest located 120 metres east of the intersection.

To improve road safety, it is proposed to install cross hatching on the eastern corner of the intersection to reinforce the NSW Road Rules that prohibit parking within 10 metres of an intersection without traffic lights. A plan of the proposal is attached for the Committee's consideration and approval.

RECOMMENDATION

That the Committee support the proposal for the implementation of a Town Entry Treatment at the southern and northern entrances to Gerroa.

BACKGROUND

An on-site meeting was held with Council and members of the Gerroa Community Association GCA on Tuesday 30 March 2021. The GCA raised various road safety concerns and suggestions to reduce the speed limits on various streets in Gerroa, including reducing Crooked River Road from 60kph to 50kph.

The request for a 40kph speed limit for all streets in Gerroa was not considered appropriate unless supported by traffic calming devices and associated traffic management infrastructure to reduce existing travel speeds to 40kph or below. Council will undertake future investigation of traffic issues raised by the GCA including traffic counts to determine what engineering treatments (if any) are required for Gerroa streets.

Transport for NSW (TfNSW) advised that factors considered in the establishment of a speed limit review include roadside development, road alignment, road condition and crash history. After completing an initial assessment of this section of the Crooked River Road, the existing 60kph limit question was found to be appropriate for the prevailing road environment and was not previously supported.

Council has been working with TfNSW regarding a proposal to install a town entry treatment implementing a high to low speed transition at the Southern and Northern entrances to Gerroa. A township entry treatment is a speed management measure that involves providing new signs and line marking at the point of transition from a high speed rural environment to a lower speed environment to coincide with entering a township.

5.4 Traffic matters - Gerroa (cont)

This treatment has been implemented in areas such as Cobargo and examples of other Council areas that have nominated for the Rural Gate-Way treatments are listed below:

- Goulburn Council nominated Braidwood Road, Tarago 100km/h down to 50km/h.
- Queanbeyan Council nominated Bungendore Rd, Bungendore 100km/h to 50km/h.
- Bega Shire Council Pambula Road 100km/h to 50km/h.

On this basis the implementation of a town entry treatment at the Gerroa township entries would provide a speed reduction for vehicles travelling from a high speed rural environment into an urban environment. The speed limit is currently 80km/h entering Gerroa from the southern and northern entrance.

Treatments may include:

- Special speed limit signs that include the name of the town on both sides of the road
- Narrow lane widths
- Red pavement surface
- Painted road shoulder markings

TfNSW currently has funding opportunities available to Councils under the Safer Roads Program which close at the end of July 2021. Determining factors for funding will be based on crash data and whether the town has a speed limit transition of at least 20km/h.



5.5 Speed humps - Bong Bong Street

RECOMMENDATION

That the existing speed hump in Bong Bong Street west of Railway Street be removed and replaced with an alternative traffic treatment with the aim to maintain speed limit compliance and pedestrian safety and minimize noise impacts in the Railway Station precinct.

BACKGROUND

Council has received correspondence from a number of residents in Bong Bong Street Kiama outlining the negative impacts generated by the existing speed cushions after installation.

The rubberised speed cushions installed in Bong Bong Street Kiama were designed in accordance with Austroads Guide to Traffic Management and endorsed by Kiama Local Traffic Committee at its December 2019 meeting.

After the public consultation conducted in April/May 2020, the speed humps and additional linemarking were installed in Bong Street with the view to improving speed limit compliance.

Although a reduction in speed has been recorded in evidence shown in speed data analysis (as a result the speed humps being installed there was a reduction in 85th percentile speeds from 52/49 km/h to 40/35 km/h respectively) there has been continued community concern reported to Council stating that the installation of the speed humps are considered inappropriate, particularly in regard to noise generation.

Council has recently collaborated with TfNSW to carry out further investigations to develop an alternative traffic management solution which will maintain speed limit compliance and associated pedestrian safety at this location and minimise noise

5.5 Speed humps - Bong Bong Street (cont)

impacts. An alternate concept proposal for the intersection is shown below, that consists of:

- Replacing the western speed hump in Bong Bong Street, with a road narrowing slow point (similar to that existing near the Bong Bong / Shoalhaven Streets intersection);
- A raised marked pedestrian crossing near the railway station exit;
- Duplication of the existing speed cushion for westbound traffic, east of the railway bridge.
- Associated linemarking and signposting.

A mini roundabout at the intersection has also been included in the concept, however this will need further investigation and has been excluded from the initial implementation.


The proposed pedestrian crossing will provide the most direct route for pedestrian crossing of Bong Street to the carparking to the south. Previous concerns with a pedestrian crossing at this location due to perceived sight distance limitations for westbound traffic due to the railway overbridge, have been investigated and confirmed as complying with Austroads guides for a 50kph road. However it should be noted that the existing speed cushion to the east of the overbridge has substantially reduced vehicle speeds on this approach

Council will seek grant funding from TfNSW to improved Train / Pedestrian activity to improve connectivity around railway stations and is seeking support of the Committee on the intersection proposal

5.6 Destination Kiama – Ignite Kiama Winter Festival 2021 – Traffic Management Plan (cont)

Showcasing the magnificent Kiama foreshore and taking place in the lead up to the shortest day of the year the Winter Solstice (and the countdown back to summer), the festival is for one day only.

The festival will be staged at the Old School Flat Kiama commencing at 3.00pm until 8.00pm on Saturday 19 June 2021.

This is an inaugural event with the aim to be an annual event with an expected attendance of up to 5000 people.

The event is being promoted as a family friendly event targeted at the local community. Large family crowds including children may be expected, which would pose significant disruption with the possibility of high pedestrian activity on the road and surrounds.

Subsequently, Destination Tourism have engaged a consultant to prepare a Traffic Management Plan outlining Road Closures – Saturday 19th June 2021, from 12.30pm - 10.00pm in Shoalhaven Street, from Minnamurra Street intersection and on the western side of the overhead Railway Bridge. Local business houses in Shoalhaven Street opposite the Old School Flat, comprising of the Sebel Hotel and Penny Whistlers Cafe have been advised

Traffic management plans for this event have been prepared by CATO Location Services and a Road Occupancy Licence has been obtained from TfNSW as shown attached. The road closures will be undertaken by suitably qualified Council staff and traffic controllers in compliance with the Traffic Management Plans.




5. Ingress and Egress Maps




6. Event Vehicles, Access for Staff, Suppliers, Contractors

a. Service Vehicles

Service vehicles such as garbage trucks will be located onsite during the event and parked in the garbage compound located on the map below. These vehicles will not be permitted to move during the event.





b. Event vehicles

- 4 x barriers on pedestrian area at the intersection of Minnamurra and Shoalhaven
 Street (outside Yves)
- 4 x barriers on the pedestrian area under the Railway Bridge on Shoalhaven Street

 These WFB will be placed at a 45-degree angle as to not impede on pedestrian thoroughfare.







Placement brief

- Footpath crossing the road is to be kept open
- Vehicles are to be placed in centre of road
- Water filled vehicle rated barriers are to be placed on a 45 degree angle to allow for pedestrian access.

10. Access for Local Residents and Businesses

11. Access for Emergency Vehicles

Emergency vehicle access will be accommodated through all road closure locations. There will be a CATO Traffic Controller at each location to facilitate this as quickly as possible and as required. _____

Event/traffic personnel should meet the ambulance at the road closure to escort them safely through the event site.

12. Advertising Traffic Management


